Volume 1 - The Winter Fiancés

Ophélie lives on the peaceful Ark of Anima. Behind her affectionate old animated scarf, her myopic glasses and her clumsy hands, she hides two great singular talents: she is a *Reader*, able to see the past of objects just by touching them, and to perceive the feelings and thoughts of the successive proprietors of these objects, going back the past as far as the time before the apocalypse. Her second talent, still more seldom on Anima: she is able to move from one place to another by walking through mirrors.

Ophélie is the curator of the Family museum where she has developed her exceptional talent as a *Reader*. Until the day the Deans of Anima, the women in charge of governing the Ark on behalf of Artemis, the Family Spirit, decide to marry her to Thorn, an unknown and hostile man belonging to the powerful Clan of the Dragons on the Ark of the Pole, the Family Spirit of which is Lord Farouk, the brother of Artemis.

The wedding between Thorn and Ophélie is to take place one year after their engagement but in-between, Ophélie has to follow her fiancé to the Citacielle, the amazing capital city of the Pole that floats over the icy land of the Ark. She is accompanied by Rosaline, her widowed aunt and godmother, as a chaperon for the duration of the engagement. She quickly discovers that trusting anyone in the Citacielle is impossible, and that many wonders of the city are just fake.

Ophélie wonders about Thorn's motives for their marriage. Why was she chosen, whilst there is obviously no affinity between them? Why does she have to hide her identity as Mime, a mute lad in the service of Dame Berenice, the aunt of Thorn, the favourite of Lord Farouk and mother-to-be of his child, a stratagem allegedly meant to protect her until the day of wedding? How comes that Thorn, the Superintendent of the Citacielle gifted with an exceptional memory, is so much hated by everyone? Under those circumstances, how is she going to survive the terribly cold winter of the Pole?

Under the disguise of Mime the mute servant, Ophélie progressively becomes acquainted with the hostile atmosphere of the Citacielle and with the rivalries, sometimes deadly, between the various clans of the Pole: the Dragons, the Mirages, the Web, the Illusionists, the Chroniclers, the Nihilists, each clan gifted with its own talent.

As Mime, Ophélie undergoes a succession of painful trials: cruelly and repeatedly hurt by the mental claws of the Dragons, including those of Dame Berenice, sent to jail for the alleged murder of Ma Hildegarde, the scandalous and foreign architect of the Citacielle, subject to an odious blackmail by Gustave the majordomo of the Embassy. Thanks to her

special talents, and at some points, reluctantly helped by Thorn who still remains distant, Ophélie succeeds in overcoming all those obstacles and, with the help of Gaëlle, the very last survivor of the Nihilist clan, to save her aunt Rosaline from the mental trap set by the Knight, an Illusionist.

Little by little, she also understands the incredible plot she is the center of. On the occasion of the marriage with Thorn, the Ceremony of the Donation will take place, monitored by a member of the Web clan. This ceremony will allow an exchange of talents between the two spouses, adding the Animist *Reader* talent of Ophélie to the extraordinary Chronicer memory talent of Thorn. Thorn should then be able to translate the Book of Lord Farouk, a mysterious book and a relic of the past nobody has ever been able to decipher.

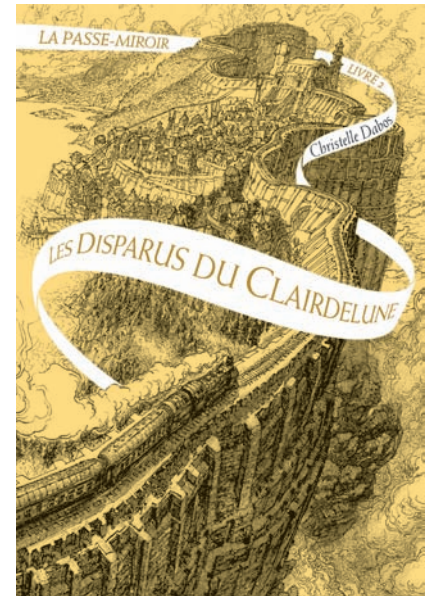
At the end of this first volume of the series, and further to the dramatic elimination of the clan of the Dragons during their yearly Spring Hunt, obviously orchestrated by the Knight, Thorn and Dame Berenice have no choice but to reveal the true identity of Ophélie and to bring her in full light at the Court of Lord Farouk. Ophélie decides that, in spite of the constraints and obligations that are going to weight heavy on her for the rest of her, she will remain herself and the master of her destiny.

Volume 2 - The Missing Ones of the Moonlight Embassy

Once officially introduced, Ophélie discovers the political plots and tensions that hide behind the social whirl of the Court. Between the arrival of her Anima family on the Pole and the demands of Farouk, Ophélie has no choice, but to rely upon Thorn, her enigmatic fiancé. When the Ambassador Archibald disappears, the Anima Reader has to call on her talents in order to investigate. A mission that leads her much further than planned, to the heart of a truth more fearsome than what she had ever imagined...

THE AUTHOR

Christelle Dabos was born in 1980 in Cannes. More imaginative than intellectual, she begins to write whilst still studying at the university. After setting up in Belgium, she works as a librarian, but a heavy disease arrives. Writing then becomes the escape from the medical machinery, then a slow reconstruction and finally a second nature. Her companion, her family and a writers' Website community encourage her to submit *La Passe-Miroir* she had been working on for a long time to the Gallimard Jeunesse First Novel Competition.
